

Accessibility at Annapolis Pride's Parade and Festival

Annapolis Pride is committed to the thriving of everyone in Annapolis and Anne Arundel County. We have listened to and taken seriously the requests of community members with disabilities to make the event more accessible.

To make the event accessible to more people, we have implemented the following:

- 1. A section of the parade route is set aside for people with disabilities and mobility issues. That section is located near the corner of West Street and Amos Garrett Blvd. After the parade, there will be an accessible shuttle available to take people to the festival.
- 2. Some of the buses transporting people to and from the parade and festival are ADA accessible. Please be patient if the bus that arrives first is not accessible, because there will be one coming.
- The Maryland Hall and Bates Field stages will have American Sign Language (ASL)
 interpreters throughout the festival. We are excited to partner with HOD Interpreting,
 LLC, which has both hearing and deaf interpreters.
